# Ryan Field Adventure

Ryan Airfield was built by the United States Army Air Forces in 1942 as a site for primary flight training. Military flight training at Ryan ceased in 1944 and the property was conveyed to the State of Arizona in 1948. Currently owned by the City of Tucson, Ryan Field is operated by the Tucson Airport Authority under an agreement which expires in 2054.

On Saturday morning, June 16, 2012, an entourage from the Tucson Corvair Association made the journey to this historic airfield 10 miles southwest of downtown Tucson and enjoyed breakfast at Todd's Restaurant. Making the trip were Lynn Marrs, Bill Maynard, Van and Vicki Pershing, Charlie and Sandy Evans with their son, Clayton, Ken and Heidi Farr with great granddaughter, Lydia, John and Amy Young, Allen and Marianne Elvick, Ron and Lynn Bloom, Chad Ritter, Mike Lake, and Ed Segerstrom. After breakfast, John and Amy Young gave us a tour of their hangers. One hanger houses their airplane and the other their three Corvairs. Their '61 coupe and their '65 Monza are complete and have been on the road for some time. Their '66 Turbo Corsa convertible isn't quite ready to go on the road but it's getting real close.

No President's report other than thanking John and Amy for taking us on the tour of their hangers at Ryan Field and the fact that 18 people showed up for breakfast at Todd's.


Vice President's Report: No report ... V.P. not present.


Lydia and Clayton at Ryan Field

## What if.... the Corvair 300

Recently Matt Null posted some pictures of a project that is being undertaken by Jim Reich of Longmont, Colorado.

Jim says:

"In 1960, Detroit's big 3 automakers introduced their answer to the perceived marketing threat from Europe. Whether the Volkswagen was really competition is debatable but as Chevrolet soon discovered, there was definitely a strong demand for a more sporty version of our beloved Corvair. When they added bucket seats, more power, upscale interior and called it the Monza, sales took off. In fact, the success of this new direction by the Corvair spurred both Ford and Chrysler to respond with their own upscale sporty compacts. The race was on and while Chevy introduced the turbocharged 150 horsepower Spyder model in 1962, the Falcon was adding a 260 c.i. V-8 and Chrysler the V-8 powered Barracuda. Of course, it wasn't long before all of the compacts were adding bigger and bigger V-8's, including the Nova, Buick, Olds and Pontiac versions from GM. The Corvair just couldn't keep up.....gas was cheap and economy was dead.

But, what if the Corvair could have added a high performance model that could keep up. We all know bigger engines lead to higher horsepower, but given the size limitations of the Corvair flat six, bigger wasn't a good alternative. However, weight reduction is an inexpensive way of achieving the same result. The Corvair already had a unique power pack that was relatively light with air cooling and extensive use of aluminum. What if the rest of the car was put on a diet? Give up comfort and convenience in exchange for fun and big performance improvements?

Imagine a light, open air runabout that would be both fun and quick."

Here are a few pictures of the progress of Jim's project. It will be powered by a 140hp/PowerGlide. He's planning on showing the "trike" at a big car show the last weekend in July and then it will be off to the paint shop in August. This winter will be spent putting all the finishing touches on it.
