BATTERY SAFETY TIP

Whenever you disconnect your car's battery, unbook the ground terminal first. Then there's no danger of sparks if you accidentally touch your wrench to the chassis. --Corby Somerville, SDCC

RUBBER MOLDING RESTORATION

Has that molding for your doors and other areas got you stumped as to how to clean the paint overspray off and make them look clean and new? Here's a way to do it---buy yourself a bottle of black liquid Shinola leather dye and apply to the rubber molding. It will cover anything--old paint, marks, etc. After dye is dry, apply "Armor-All" and it will look like brand new.

For convenience, replace the elastic stop nuts (on the air cleaner "J" hooks) with wingnuts. This eliminates the need for a wrench to remove the air cleaner branch tubes.

CLARKS CORVAIR PARTS IN THE NEWS

Of interest to all of us are these ex "ots from the Buffalo, NY <u>Evening</u> <u>News</u> of January 1, 1978 about our friends at Clark's Corvair Parts, and written by Rick Hampson:

Cal and Joan Clark live surrounded by fenders, carburetors and fuel pumps in their home in this rural town in Western Massachusetts, (Shelburne Falls), and they say they have trouble keeping up with demand for Corvair parts.

"We both learned to drive on Corvairs", said Mrs. Clark, 28. "It handles beautifully and is good on gas" said Mr. Clark, 30, who gave up teaching high school biology to supply the world's Corvair freaks.

The Clark house is filled with boxes of auto parts. "They're in every room except the bathroom--and I think there are even some batteries in there" Mrs. Clark said.

The Clarks' catalog has grown from collaring 160 to about 3,500 items. Some 7,000 people around the world are on the mailing list. The Clarks have 2 full-time employees and 7 part-time workers.

The Clarks get 80 percent of their parts from General Motors, which built the Corvair from 1960-1969. They produce some items, like carpets and gaskets, themselves.

It's strictly a mail-order business; drop-ins are frowned on. "We allowed it at first" Mr Clark said, "but people were coming here all the time--on holidays, weekends, at night."


