THE PARK MALL SHOW A SUCCESS



WHO NEEDS VITONS?

I thought that would catch your attention. Viton O-rings, at \$10 per set, are cheap at the price when you consider the alternative of GM supplied neoprene O-rings. The Vitons last and last, while the neoprene deteriorates under the high temperature conditions extant in the Corvair engine, with the attendant oil leaks we know so well. Since the Vitons alleviate this, why should I say "Who needs Vitons?"? If you wish to save \$10 by spending 25 cents, read on.

When you do that reseal job, or when you rebuild the engine, or whenever you have to replace seals, do this: squirt some blue Permatex Silicone into the grooves in the pushrod tubes before putting the (neoprene) 0-rings in. Just load the grooves up flush, and let the excess squish out (don't wipe it off!) when you put the 0-rings in. Seat the tubes firmly, and that's it. Do the same for the rocker studs. Put down a bed of the blue Permatex Silicone on the head, seat the 0-ring on the stud and install normally.

This method does three things: 1. Prevents oil leaks (as well as Vitons); 2. is cheaper(25 cents worth of Permatex as opposed to \$10 worth of Vitons; and 3. insures easy removal when removal finally becomes necessary. I've removed pushrod tubes installed this way, and they came out by hand, after running over 50 thousand miles(with no leaks). Try it, you'll like it.
