

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

PARK MALL 1 83

OK T.C.A. It's time to show the public that CORVAIRS are still alive and running. You guessed it, it's PARK MALL SHOW TIME FOR '83. February 12th and 13th. Let's show Tucson that we have a large enthusiastic CORVAIR CLUB.

The requirements for the park mall show are minimal. You do not have to have a car in concours show condition. Just CLEAN AND WELL CARED FOR, a few parking lot paint chips won't hurt. Mine has a few paint chips, a couple of areas of cracked paint, and some oxidation that I can't rub out, but it's going in anyway. Things like that can't be helped when you like to drive your car every day like I do. Other requirments include: 1. You must only have a minimum supply of fuel in the gas tank, all other safety requirements will be taken care of after the cars are positioned in the mall. Such as, disconnect and tape battery terminals, and tape gas caps. This is a <u>must</u>, anyone showing a car MUST BE A MEMBER OF T.C.A. AND CORSA. This is an insurance company requirement and there is no way around it.

There is one more necessity for a successful show, and that is <u>VOLUNTEERS</u> to answer questions about our club such as, where we meet, how do I join? etc, help keep little sticky fingers off the paint. Volunters need only spend a couple of hours one of the two days, on the other hand we won't make you leave if you want to stay longer. I will have a sign up sheet at the January meeting.

I must notify Park Mall by Feb. 1st, how many cars we are going to display. I also need a volunteer with a good camera to take pictures for publication.

CARBURETOR JETTING

Here's a tip that just might be worth a try. Greater economy can be achieved by jetting your carburetors richer! Corvairs normally have #50 or #51 main jets. By going from #51 jets in all carburetors (140 HP in this example) to #54 jets, the results should be a cooler running engine, approximately 5 degrees additional spark advance and 1 to 2 miles more per gallon. Be sure to use the Rochester jets that have to 60 degree chamfer.

NON-INTERCHANGABLE STEERING

If there's one thing that has changed on the Corvair with each production year, it could be the steering. Most people, when they replace the steering gear box, change the box and shaft(s) from a junker as a complete assembly, especially if it's not from your model year. While this <u>usually</u> works well, don't try to install '67 - '69 steering in a '65 or a '66 or visa versa unless you're prepared for major rework. The '67-'69 assembly is of the collapsed-column design, and it incorporates a steering wheel that is less dished than previous years, hence the shaft is longer to place the wheel in a comfortable driving position. The mast jacket is also thicker - and longer. The omega-shaped under dash bracket that supports the jacket has its two mounting holes spaced about ½" further apart to accommodate the larger jacket, so the bracket won't bolt up. The hole in the bulkhead (firewall) is also 1" larger. This, of course, means that the three flange bolt holes are relocated and, to add insult to injury, the coupling located at the gearbox interfers with the frame. Now here's the good news! The standard '67-'69 boxes have a faster ratio - about 4 turns vs. 5 turns lock to lock.




