Recently I became the proud owner of a 1962 Greenbriar. This verical had a sticking throttle cable that stuck so bad, some previous owner had installed an extra heavy spring between the upright bracket on the cross linkage between the carberators and stretched it to the rear of the engine compartment. With this arrangment the driver almost had to stand on the gas pedal to make it go. Even then it sometimes would not return. That gets a little exciting when approaching a red light, (stand on the brakes, turn the key off etc).

I then decided, that had to be fixed. Now never having owned a truck of this breed before, it was all new to me. So not wanting to do something I couldn't undo, I took the careful approach. With flashlight in hand I crawled under the beast and carefully inspected the cable housing for any visable damage. Finding none, I assumed the cable might be dry. After unsuccesfully trying to force some oil into each end of the cable housing, I decided after much thought, to go for broke and remove the cable from the housing.

I then disconnected both ends of the cable and started pulling cable, 16 or 18 feet of it, (I didn't measure it). The cable was very dry. Now thinking I had it whipped,I took a can of grease and started greasing the cable as I fed it back into the housing. I soon discovered this was easier said than done. But after much struggling with the cable and the right words, I made it. After reconnecting the cable and removing the heavy spring, jumped in the driver's seat and hit the ignition expecting to experience a smooth working throttle. Boy was I suprised. That engine wound up to at least five or six thousand RPM and wouldn't slow down. I quickly turned off the ignition and after much loud noise and a few back fires it finally came to a stop. I crawled out of the truck, my ears ringing and looked out to the street and some of my neighbors were looking my way expecting something to blow any second. Now smiling on the outside (for the neighbors benifit) and embarresed and angry on the inside, I disconnected and removed the cable once more.

Now for the TECH TIP; While removing the cable this time, a thought came to me that maybe there was something else in that housing that might not belong there. So, after wiping the cable clean I started feeding it back into the housing from the rear of the truck. After hanging up slightly a couple of times it struck something solid about three feet from the front end. After struggling with it for a couple of minuts it broke free and pushed on through. Walking around to the front of the truck, I found that the cable had pushed out a couple of pieces of metal that didn't look like they belonged to the assembly. At this point the cable seemed a little looser in the housing than it had been, but not quite as free as I thought it should be. Then I had the brain storm. Rotate the cable in the housing? but how?? Ah yes, the drill motor. Now not wanting to fasten the cable strands in the chuck and risk damaging them, and knowing the bracket on the other end was formed in a 90 degree angle which would not fit in the chuck I was stymied for a second or two untill I discovered the bracket would fit in the hole in the side of the chuck were the chuck key goes and with a little electrical tape to hold it there, away we went spinning the cable in the housing at the same time pushing it back and forth the cable freed up and after reinstalling it properly, front to front etc. I now have a perfectly working throttle, and am once more a proud owner of a nice running corvair Greenbriar.

After this success, I can hardly wait to start rebushing the suspension on my 67 Monza, ha.
