

BRAKE HOSES AND CYLINDERS FOR 95's -- Gary Parsley, North Texas, December 1984

Recently while trying to get a 1962 van that had been sitting in a field since 1977 back on the road, I ran into the problem of replacing brake cylinders. Fronts were no problem, but the rears were a different story.

Unless you go through one of the specialist Corvaior parts vendors, rear Corvair van cylinders are not available. So, after doing some checking, I bought the cylinder that fits all other 1960's model Chevrolet trucks. The difference? The break hose inlet size. The Corvair van has a 1/4" straight thread, while the other Chevy trucks have a 3/16" inverted flare.

Now, the other end of the Corvair hose is also 3/16" inverted flare. So, another trip back to rummage through hoses. Found it! Now this cylinder should be available for years as it fits dozens of vehicles. The cost was less than that charged by the Corvair specialists. The new parts numbers are:

Cylinders: Raybestos Nr. WC 13387 Hose: Raybestos Nr. BH 5784



FIX FOR DIRT IN YOUR CARBS by Greg Hopewell

At times dirt may get in your carbs and clog a jet. If this happens while you are driving, a fix is to first remove the air cleaner. Start the engine and find which carb is clogged. Do this by placing your palm over part of the throat of the carb. If no change in idle, that carb is clogged.

To remedy the problem, place your palm over the whole carb while running the engine. Give engine full throttle for about a second while holding your hand over the carb. This should suck the dirt out. If not, repeat until the dirt is removed and idle is normal.




