

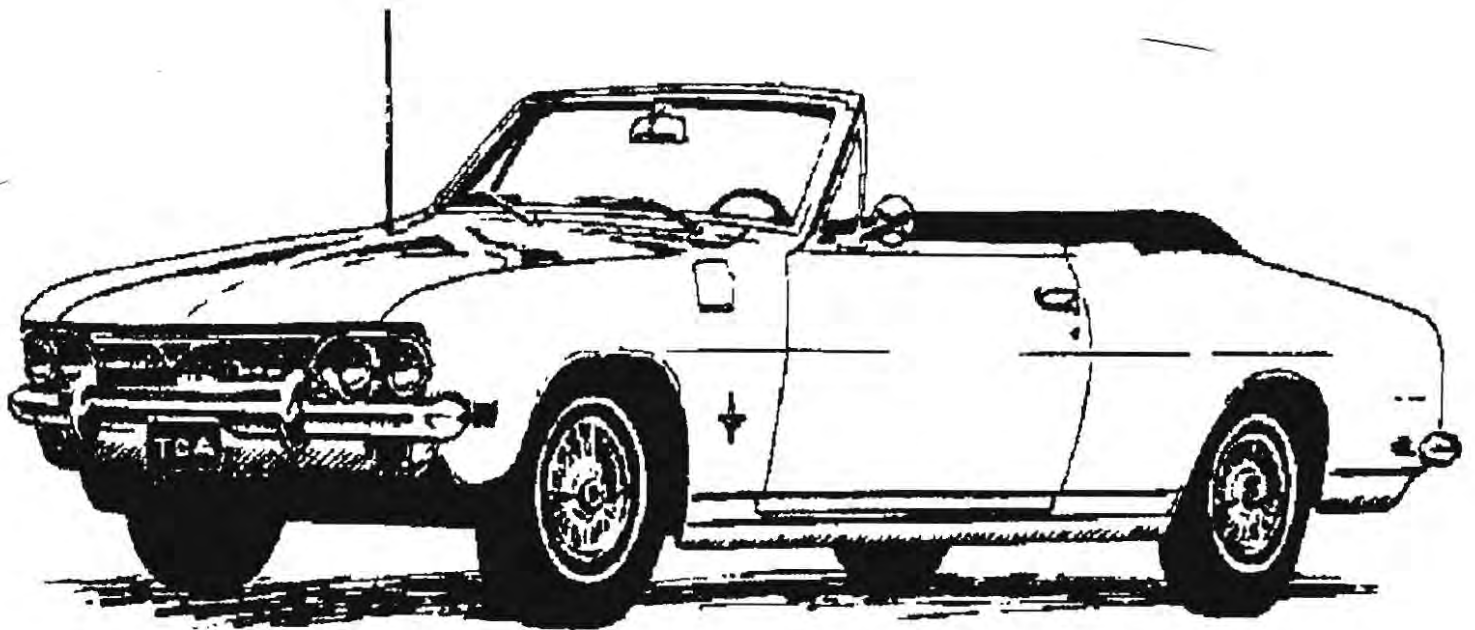

FROM THE PRESIDENT



There was a round of applause for the Bakers' Barbecue for members of the Corvair Club; and Beverly announced that party pictures taken that evening are available in the library.


BILL LESLIE reported on his committee's search for a place for the Christmas Party. The date will be tentavely December 14, and the place under consideration is Webb's Steak House.

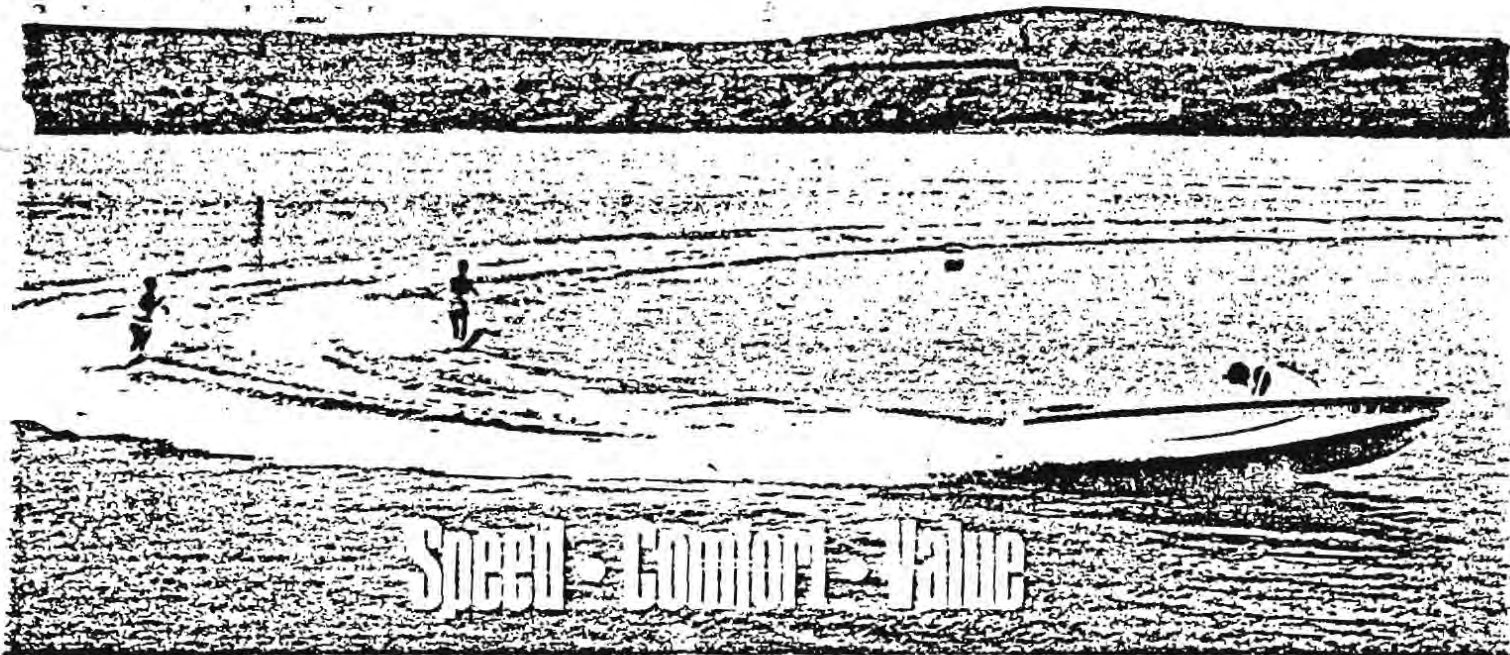
BARRY CUNNINGHAM brought an engine block, and gave an enlightening "show and tell".
