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

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
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
is arrive is inspired by a very memorable experience that took place early in my driving career. The year was 1963, and my grandfather and I had just gotten my first car on the road. It was a 1948 Chevrolet Fleetline with a six cylinder engine and a three speed vacuum shift transmission.

I have to admit that the radio and moon wheel covers were much more important to me at that time than a boring rebuild of the brake system. That is, up until the afternoon I blew through a busy intersection after a rubber brake hose burst and left the car with no brakes. After I cleaned up the interior I immediately did a complete overhaul of the brake system. The brakes were finally in great shape, but I couldn't help thinking



about the possibility of another total brake failure if anything in the entire brake system malfunctioned.

After 1967 when all new cars incorporated two separate brake systems, I never really thought too much




about a total brake failure until last year. I got a 1964 Corvair for my daughter, Erin as her first car. When I first looked under the hood, make that the trunk, I saw that little single shot master cylinder and knew that something would have to change.

Reliable brakes are something I demand, and, at the expense of factory original correctness, this is how I changed our Corvair brake system. First I selected the dual master cylinder that was used on the '67 - '69 Corvair and almost every other GM drum brake car from 1967 through 1974. This master cylinder bolted up perfectly and fit the original push rod. It has the same 1" bore and the pedal pressure is unchanged. The next step was disconnecting the rear brake line from the brake block underneath the dash and putting a plug in the block. A 1/2" hole was drilled into the trunk to allow the rear brake line to be extended to the front port of the master cylinder. The original brake line in the trunk was replaced by a 3/16" X 12" line and connected to the rear port of the master cylinder. The required adapters are shown in the drawings.

The parts for this project are readily available at local auto parts stores. The master cylinder is available in Wagner (F64986) or EIS (E64986) in either new or rebuilt. The brake lines and adapters are available in Everco, Champ, or Bundy Flex. Once the parts are collected the project takes about an hour to complete at a cost of under \$60. Be sure to bench bleed the new master cylinder before you install it, and be careful with any spilled brake fluid because it will damage painted surfaces.

I hope all you daily drivers will seriously consider this modification because around this town we need all the help we can get.



How many of you have a sink for post-Corvairing hand washing that the EPA is beginning to consider a hazardous waste site? Chances are the thing is a sick milky gray that hasn't been cleaned since your car was new because you're the one who is supposed to wash it.
